### General Pool Rules:

- Outside food and drink are welcome, however glass containers are prohibited.
- Smoking, and alcoholic beverages are not allowed inside the pool fence.
- Children 12 years and younger must be accompanied by an adult (18+) to the pool. Any non-swimming child must be accompanied by an adult in the water.
- Any inappropriate language or behavior will result in dismissal from the pool for the day.

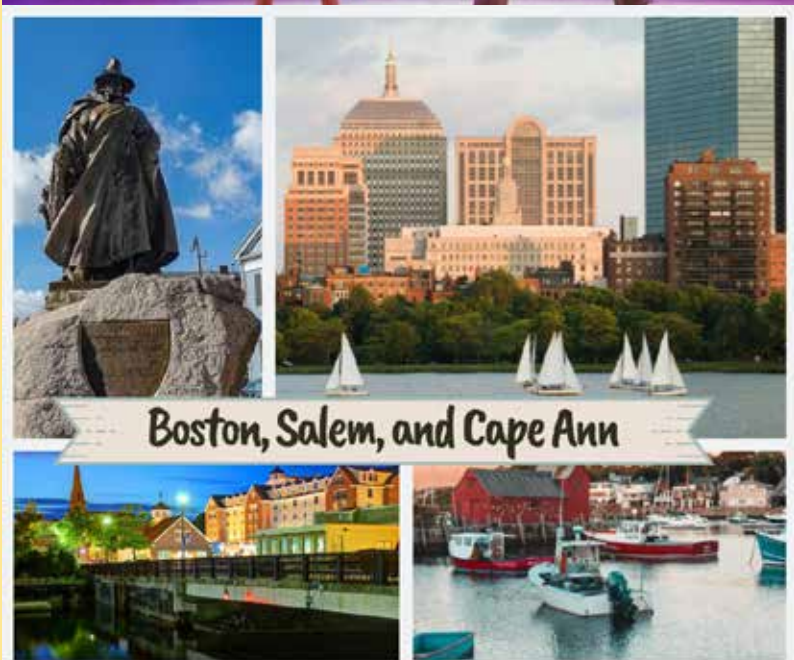
## Boston, Salem, & Cape Ann

## Parent-Child Beginner Rock Climbing and Rappelling

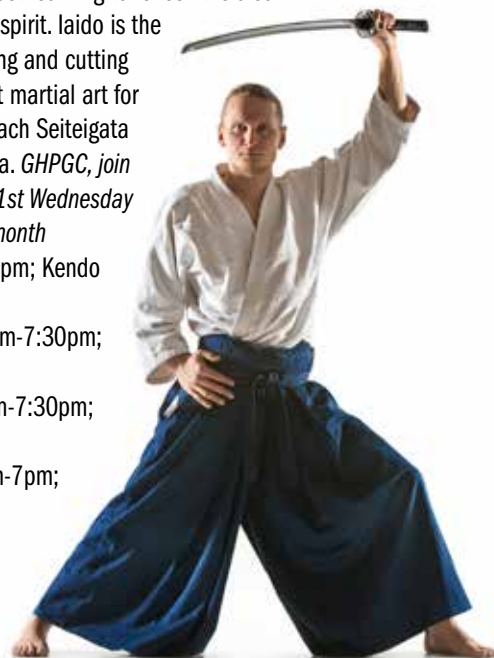

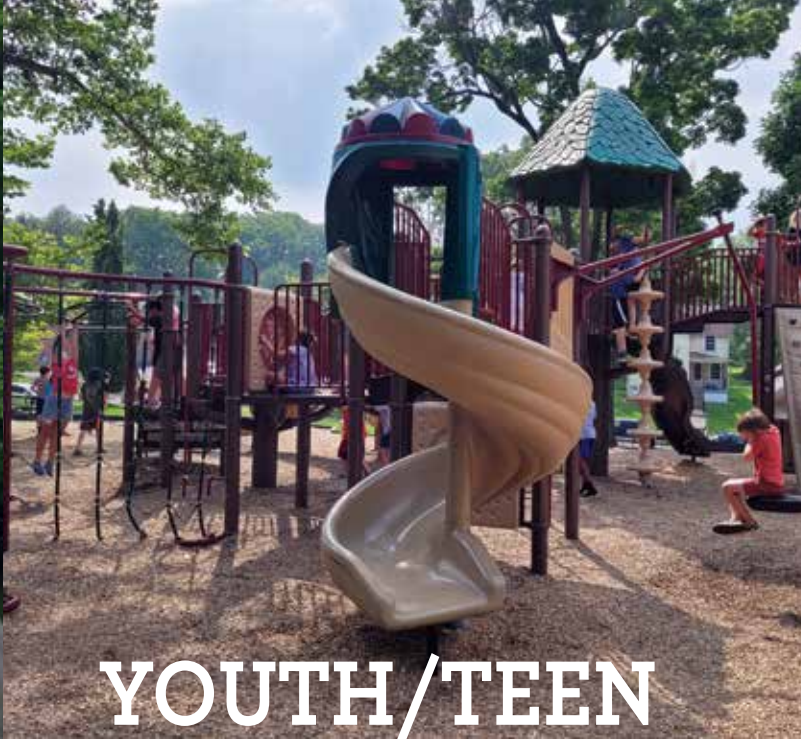


## Staunton Braves Baseball
